

# We're making this route more accessible for everyone.



The new name for Sustrans

Thanks to funding from National Highways, we're making it easier for everyone to walk, wheel and cycle along this stretch of National Cycle Network Route 7, between Moor Row and Parkside.

## Path resurfacing

We're replacing the current surface and widening the path to 2.5m.

This creates more space for everyone, and smoother, more comfortable journeys.



## Removing/redesigning access barriers

Barriers on the path can make it difficult, and sometimes impossible, for people using wheelchairs, mobility scooters or adapted cycles to access the route.

We'll be removing some barriers completely and replacing others with chicanes to allow everyone to enjoy the path.



## Preventing flooding


We're improving existing drainage along the route to prevent water collecting on the surface.

This helps make journeys on foot, mobility aids and cycles cleaner and drier all-year-round.

## Closures and diversions

This route will be closed for around six weeks from **Monday 26th January 2026**.

Diversions will be in place during the work, which could add time to journeys.



## Biodiversity works

This section of the National Cycle Network is an important place for nature too. As part of this project, we will work to protect and maintain existing habitats.

This includes:

- Re-seeding disturbed and/or damaged grassland verges
- Creating wetland scrapes
- Installing bat and bird boxes
- Creating hibernacula (toad abodes), butterfly scrapes and banks.
